annually.

George is safe, & pretty well.
His curving at 7.5. and practice
is fast decreasing; and I am
counting the days to the 15th.
They will be heavy ones I fear,
seeing the examination that is to
be done in them; but this must
end in the May day, right or wrong.

I only fear that I shall have to
have some things in confusion.

I suppose the enclosed bill is
all right - but I do not like
to pay it unless you certify it

I shall greatly miss my
Sunday evenings & happiness: but
I must ^{not} leave the hospital again
this week. Three days absence is
a thing unheard-of: & this I have
always been guilty of.

I hope to have better accounts
of your arm. Indeed, dearest, I
feel quite ashamed of the trouble
that I gave you in the dinner &
evening, and not the less so
because all was so well done, &
thoroughly successful. Take my
thanks ~~with~~ sweet me: & have
the consolation of feeling that
you served some of the good
will & the profits that may

come of it -
