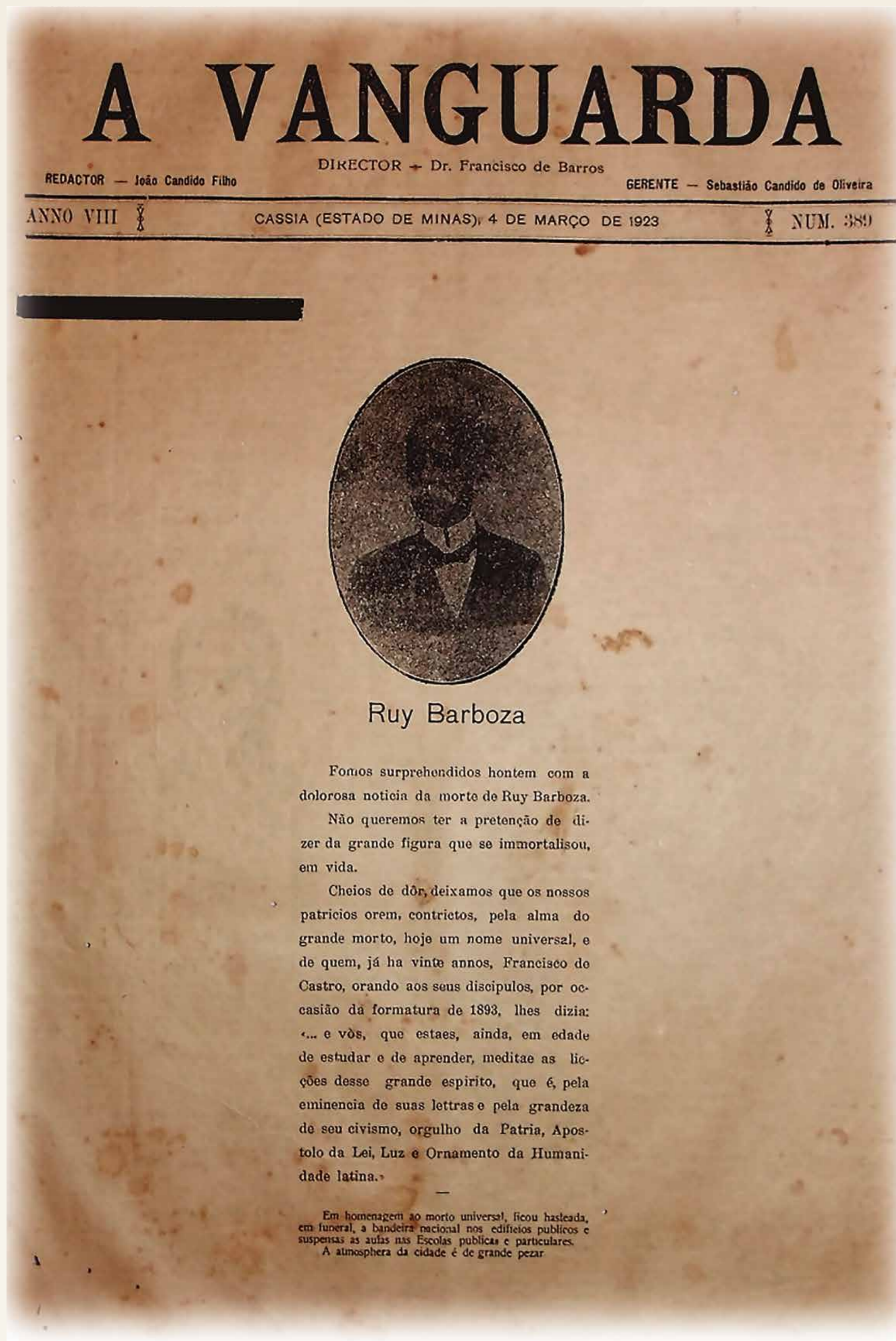
Rui Barbosa's family in Petrópolis, next to the coffin; here we see Batista Pereira, Maria Adélia, and Alfredo Rui Barbosa.



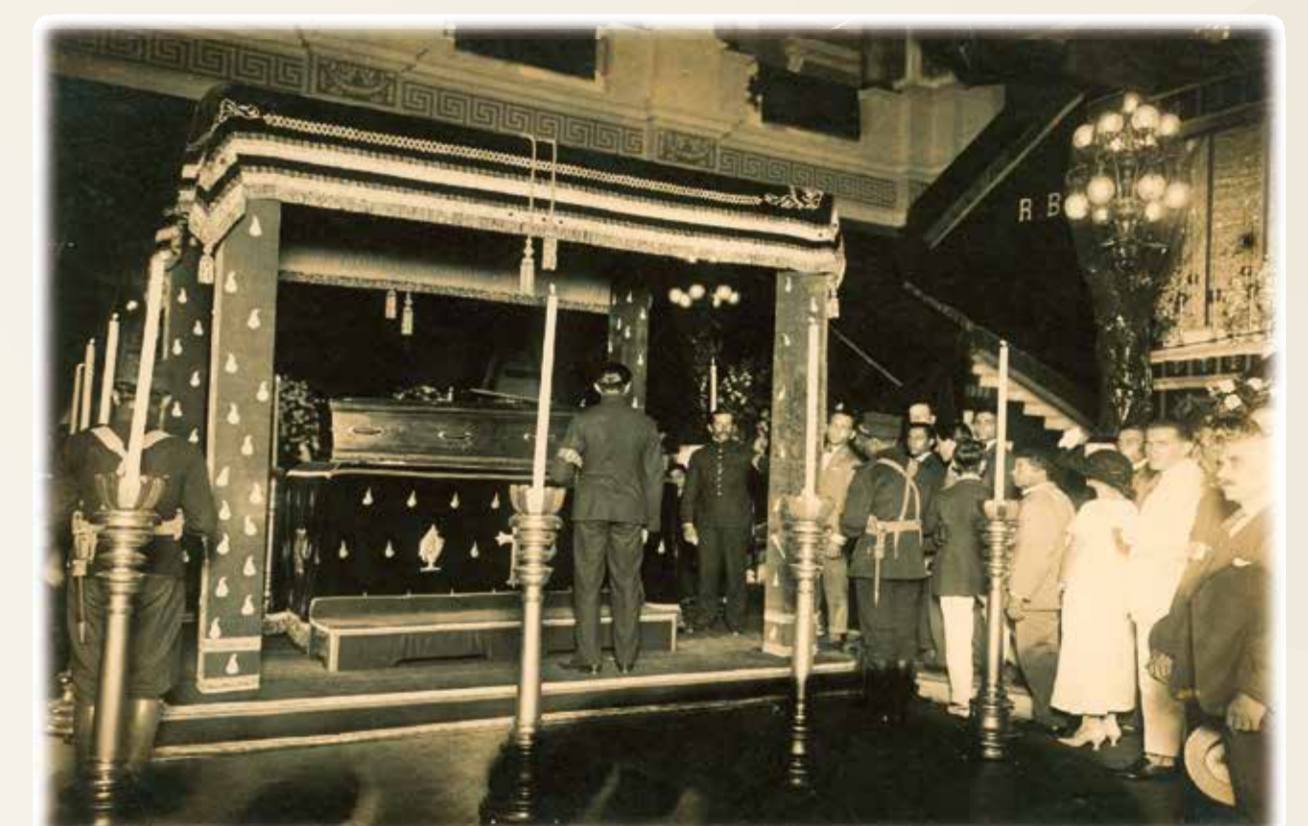

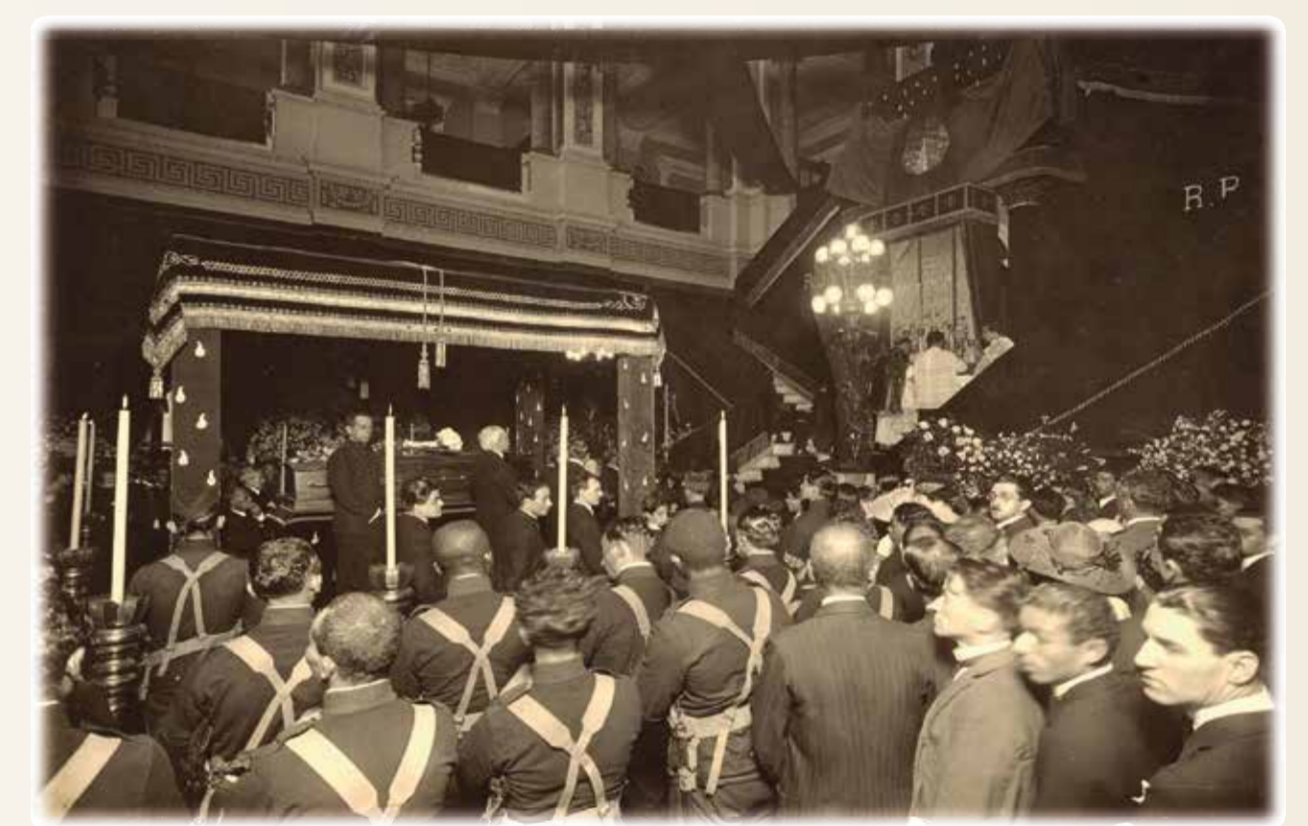
